2010 Membership Fees

Membership in ARC is targeted at local, provincial and federal governments, and related non-governmental organizations and businesses. Membership fees in ARC are assessed based on the number of 'seats' an organization wishes to reserve at each of the webinars.

The 2010 membership fee per seat for local governments, public health units and non-governmental organizations is **\$500**. Local governments or organizations with multiple departments in different locations are encouraged to consider a membership of more than 1 seat.

The 2010 membership fee per seat for provincial and federal government departments is **\$1000**. Provincial and federal departments with multiple offices are encouraged to consider memberships of more than 1 seat.

Memberships for individuals may be negotiated by request.
